A lot of information from our legislative update on 3-1-21

Speaker Jason Frierson will introduce legislation to make mail-in ballots permanent without safeguards to protect election integrity. This still at the bill draft request level. Email him at Jason.Frierson@asm.state.nv.us, and ask him not to sponsor this Bill.

Please sign the petition to bring <u>AB 134</u> to a Committee hearing. <u>AB 134</u> would repeal the mail-in ballot rule implemented before the November 2020 elections. We collected 70 signatures over the weekend and submitted them to Assemblywoman Brittany Miller. More being collected, be at Thursdays event to sign.

<u>SJR8</u> is back again. This bill allows transgender men to compete with biological women in sports. Essentially destroying any hope of a scholarship for a women in sports. Equal pay for equal work was mandated in the 1960's so let's not accept that this is not an equal rights bill. Many women's groups are standing up against it. Please call today to oppose this Bill in committee and kill it.

<u>AB 175</u> creates an informed consent standard for abortion. Requires the attending physician to offer the woman to view a sonogram of the fetus. <u>AB 176</u> Creates a parental notification standard for minor undergoing an abortion. These are bills we can ask for a yes vote for.

AB 163 is a bill that requires voter ID which DMV will provide at no cost as applicable. This is a step in the right direction to stop voter fraud. Everyone needs a ID to drive or fly. Why not vote? Please support this bill; call and write your legislative representative to pass this bill.

On Tuesday, March 2, at 1:00pm <u>SB 74</u> goes into discussion. This bill allows the governor to override the census data and choose the population data that he certifies for allocating funds. We do not want to give him more power over our lives. Please ask for a no vote.

On Wednesday, March 3rd, <u>SB 183</u> revises Collective Bargaining for unions. Remove the compliance requirements such as open meeting laws. Keep alert for more information.

On Thursday, March 4th, <u>AB 141</u> will be up. This calls for a 90 notice for evictions without cause and the automatic sealing of records for evictions related to defaults in rent payments. This will make rentals less desirable by owners and result in less rental units available for rent.

<u>AB 164</u> Allows Pharmacist to provide contraceptives to <u>anyone</u> without a prescription or parental consent. Please call for a no vote.

<u>SB 152</u> requires a public school with more than 500 pupils to list on its website information relating to the learning materials and activities that was used for public instruction during the immediately preceding school year. Increases transparency in what our children are being taught. Please support this bill.

Lastly, this Thursday morning (March 4th) at 10 am a group will gather in front of the Capital building to submit election complaints to the Secretary of State. This is not a CCRCC sponsored event, yet all are encouraged to attend. We need to show good showing with media present to encourage our Secretary of State to investigate the complaints. Please be there.
